

From International Christian Concern:

Ethiopia/Libya: Militant Islamic terror group ISIS released a new video Sunday, April 19, reportedly showing the gruesome murder of 30 Ethiopian Christian men in Libya. The footage alternates between two scenes: one in northern Libya on a Mediterranean beach where 15 men were beheaded, and one in the desert in southern Libya where another 15 men were shot in the head, execution-style. The identities of the victims have yet to be confirmed.

Italy/North Africa: According to reports, 15 migrants, all allegedly Muslim, have been arrested by authorities in Italy after murdering 12 other migrants, apparently all Christian, and throwing them overboard. The Christians were from Ghana and Nigeria and were heading to Italy, when a brawl broke out, leading to the deaths of the 12. BBC has stated that the Muslim men were charged with "multiple aggravated murder motivated by religious hate," once they arrived at Palermo in Sicily.

Iran: American-Iranian Pastor Saeed Abedini remains in prison in Iran, serving an eight-year sentence for his religious beliefs and activities. According to his family, Saeed has repeatedly been told that if he were to deny his Christian faith he would go free, and that if he refuses to convert to Islam they will continue to extend his sentence. He has already been held for more than two and a half years.
